Please allow this to serve as notice pursuant to Open Meeting Law, M.G.L. c. 30A sections 18-25 of the first meeting of the Hampden Commission on the Status of Women.

On April 25, 2017, The Massachusetts Commission on the Status of Women inaugurated nine new commissioners to a newly formed regional commission created to study and report the status of women and girls in Hampden County. "The Massachusetts Commission on the Status of Women is a state-established body charged with reviewing the status of women in Massachusetts and offering recommendations regarding policy that would improve access to opportunities and equality."
