The DPW would like to remind residents that next weeks' recyclables are glass, containers and metals. Transfer Station permits are available. License and Registration is required. The fee is \$20.00 for residents and free for anyone 62 yrs. and older.

According to the States figures, Ludlow had 283 positive Covid-19 cases from Jan 2nd - Jan 16th with 3026 tests being conducted. The Board of Health reports that there were 83 new cases last week. Please visit www.mass.gov/info-details/covid-19-state-of-emergency
