Good Evening this is Angela Kramer, Public Health Nurse for the Town of Ludlow. Currently we have 65 positive COVID-19 Cases from April 4 to April 12.

Tonight I would like to review a few common questions regarding COVID-19.

Anyone who is fully vaccinated must continue to follow the state guidelines by remaining socially distance in a private and public setting, for all types of outings and events. All 3 vaccines are very safe and effective, however, we all still to remain diligent in our surroundings.

As the contact tracer for the Board of Health we are beginning to see some trends in our schools and events. We are asking all parents to please refrain your children from attending school or sports if they are not feeling well with Covid type symptoms and if tested to remain home until you receive the test results. At that time a school nurse will advise when the child can return to school. You may also contact the Board of Health if you are uncertain about when to return to work or other events if you have not been notified. If we all work together to help stop the spread, we will reduce our incidence of being in the red for the town. By working together we will reduce the amount of exposure to one another and our families.

We continue to see a higher increase in our 20-30 year old individuals throughout the Commonwealth. We are asking you

all to please care and support one another in our efforts to reduce the spread. By doing this we will be able to return to our normal patterns of living we were used to prior to the virus.

The Governor announced as of April 19 all individuals age 16 and older will be able to sign up for a COVID-19 vaccine. We encourage you all to begin signing up and when your turn arrives you will be contacted. You will be notified if you have pre-registered where your vaccination will be held.
