Governor Baker and Lt. Governor Polito are lifting all COVID-19 restrictions effective May 29th and will be lifting the State of Emergency effective June 15th. As of May 29th, mask wearing will be an advisory, not a mandate. It is recommended that all unvaccinated persons continue to wear a mask in public and masks will still be required on public transportation. Town Hall and other municipal buildings will be fully open for business effective June 1st.
