This weeks' Important messages from a few boards in our community.

From the Board of Health - As of today, we have 3 new cases and 10 pending cases of Covid-19.

COVID-19 can be spread by people who do not have symptoms' and do not know that they are infected. It's important to stay vigilant and practice all the necessary prevention measures. Wear your mask or face covering, keep 6ft distancing from others and wash your hands or hand sanitize often.

Remember that this is also mosquito and tick season. Wear repellent and dress accordingly.

The Town and Police Department want to advise residents that there is a mail solicitation for Covid 19 Benefits Relief for personal loans under the guise of Covid-19 municipal funding. The return address says Administrative Offices, Ludlow, MA. The Town is not involved in this in anyway. Residents need to be aware of scams and fraud during these trying times.

The DPW would like resident to know that this upcoming week recyclable products will be containers, bottles and cans. Also, there is a limited number of blue recyclable bins available at the Transfer station.

The Hubbard Memorial Library is still closed to the public but is accepting online and phone requests for curbside pickup. The book drop is open for returns. Please feel free to check out the online resources.

Due to Covid-19, The Haviland Beach is closed for the summer. Please do not try to access the beach as you will be asked to leave.

Due to the Governor's Orders, please remember all Town facilities are still closed to the public until further notice. - but we do encourage you to use the walk-up service windows located at the back of the building for the Board of Health, Town Clerk, and Tax Collector. Windows are open Monday thru Friday, 9:00a.m. to 3:00 p.m.

The Senior Center would like to remind everyone that while it is closed, they are still there for you if you require services. The van is now running in town on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays. Outdoor activity has also begun. Call the Center for more information at 583-3564.
