The DPW would like to remind residents that next weeks' recyclables are paper and cardboard. The Transfer Station permits will be available beginning Jan 4<sup>th</sup>. License and Registration is required. The fee is \$20.00 for residents and is Free for 62 yrs. and older.

According to the States figures, Ludlow had 273 positive Covid-19 tests from Dec. 6<sup>th</sup> thru Dec 19<sup>th</sup> with 2765 tests being conducted.
